Planet earth is up for discussion

EXCITEMENT is building for the inaugural Womad 'EarthStation' festival being held at Belair National Park this month, which has a line up including US singer Rickie Lee Jones and panellists Cate Blanchett and Andrew Upton.

The three-day festival being held October 21-23, brings together an eclectic mix of entertainment, music, food and wine as well as talks by leading scientists, academics, writers and thinkers.

"The aim of the weekend is to raise awareness of environmental issues in an enjoyable and entertaining, but thought provoking way," Ian Scobie, Womad 'EarthStation' Director told *The Blackwood Times*.

"There is an extensive music program, plus a market as well as detailed discussions all being held in a lovely location."

Environmental subjects being discussed at the festival range from 'Greening Australia's economy' and 'Populate or Perish' to 'River, Estuary, Sea: Who cares about the Coorong'.

Local organisations are also exhibiting; Andrew Tidswell from the Blackwood Hills Sustainable Communities Group confirmed the group would be encouraging participants to consider how we can reduce our individual ecological footprint and join with others in local communities to reduce our use of the earth's resources.

Event sponsors, Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) District Ranger Kerri Villiers said it's refreshing to see South Australia's first national park showcased in a new light and it is a great way for DENR to engage with a new generation of park users.

Festival supporter, Mitcham Council will be featuring a number of sustainable projects. "We are supporting the festival in a small way, providing shuttle buses and traffic and waste management," confirmed Mayor Michael Picton.

As well as Rickie Lee Jones, the music line up includes Adelaide's The Audrey's and indigenous performer Frank Yamma. There are also performers from China, Africa, India and the Adelaide Chamber Singers will accompany Kronos Quartet's 'Sun Rings' performance.

With up to 3000 people expected to attend organisers are encouraging people to take advantage of the regular shuttle buses, provided by Mitcham Council, running from Blackwood train station to Long Gully.

Tickets to the event include public transport costs from city and the shuttle bus to Long Gully.

Help break poverty cycle

ONE of the biggest challenges facing Africa with it's growing population is food production - however, one Hawthorndene resident is doing something about it.

Chris Pietsch, (pictured) is an ex-farmer with 20 years experience, and has been visiting Uganda to help educate and train locals how to better use their agricultural resources.

A wise man once said, 'Give a man a fish, feed him for a day! Teach a man to fish, feed him for a lifetime! - which is Chris's mission. The group behind the project is 'Grow Africa' (part of the World Relief Overseas Aid Fund).

"We are trying to help break the cycle of poverty in Africa by establishing model demonstration gardens and small farms that will be multiplied across Africa," said Chris.

"On the last trip to Uganda in March, Grow Africa purchased 20 acres of land to set up a demonstration farm to grow tropical fruit such as banana's, pineapple's,



ples, mango's and other crops; as well as raising farm animals for local farmers to provide a sustainable income."

Development is difficult without finances, so Chris is holding a 'Ugandan Grow Fundraiser' on Saturday, October 22 at 6pm in the Blackwood Senior Citizens Club, Young Street, Blackwood.

An exciting evening is planned with food including a 'pig on the spit' plus chicken and salads, dessert & coffee, and alcohol can be purchased. Entertainment will be provided by African singers with drums & more!

Tickets are \$25 per head or \$65 per family (2 adults & 2 children) with the proceeds going towards the development of the farm purchased in Uganda.

A small donation goes along way in Uganda - \$3 for a fruit tree up to \$500 for a cow.

Crucial programs in jeopardy

EVEN though retailers are currently experiencing difficult trading conditions, an increasing number of Blackwood businesses are contributing to the running of local groups and clubs.

From community centres and sporting clubs to local charities, the chances are you'll find a local business supporting it; not just through monetary donations either, but by giving time and providing services.

Furthermore contrary to big business, Blackwood businesses are lending their support for philanthropic reasons rather than for a return on their investment.

"It's not about expecting something in return, it's about helping people and giving back to the community," explains Blackwood Dyno Tune & Service owner Ricky Monserrat, who's helping the 'Beacon - Emergency Relief Program', run by the Mitcham Hills Interchurch Council.

This program assists people in need in the Hills area and Aileen Templeton, Beacon - Emergency Relief coordinator says Beacon has helped around 130 families and is well supported by local businesses.

A number of disadvantaged families have been helped by Blackwood Dyno Tune who carry out repairs on their cars to help them get to job interviews and to do the school run.

"Cars can be expensive, but they are essential and by doing what we're doing, we're keeping people safe," Ricky adds. "But it's not just us involved in this program - we work with other automotive businesses on these cars including Repco and Tyrepower Blackwood."

Monserrat's view is shared by Grant Jacobs, proprietor of Jacobs Tyres & More which supports the Coromandel Community Centre. Grant lives close to the centre which is partly why he sponsors it. "Plus we're a family based-business and like the idea of encouraging family activities at the centre."



Jodie Kelly, Coromandel Community Centre Program Support Officer is extremely grateful for Jacobs Tyres & More help and highlights non-profit organisations are competing more for limited funding opportunities. "If alternative funding possibilities are not sought out, the long term status and viability of such crucial community programs and activities will be in jeopardy," she says. "So if I see a business is doing something for the local community, I'm more likely to shop there."

Some of these associations have started from personal involvement. Caddle Crash Repairs and Edenwood Autos have been supporting the Blackwood Football Club for over 30 years.

"My dad started supporting the Club when we were playing there as kids and we've simply carried on," explains Edenwood Autos Geoff Caddle. "We support a number of sporting clubs; my daughter plays netball, so we support her club too."

Blackwood Football Club spokesperson Greg Langham says, "Although we receive funding from several sources, it is the local sponsorship which definitely helps. But our sponsors aren't just helping us; other clubs and organisations use our facilities such as the soccer club and Step into Life."

There are many organisations and clubs in the Blackwood district which simply would not survive without the support of local business.

And ultimately local businesses would not be able to help these various groups, clubs and charities unless people shopped locally and supported local retailers.

With Christmas fast approaching, think seriously about where you are going to do your shopping. Money spent at Marion Westfield or in the city will never find its way back in to our local community.

It's a great community to live in - let's keep it that way. □

Live music venue needs your support

WITH many members having gone to war to help give us the freedom we enjoy in Australia today - now the Blackwood Community RSL club needs your help!

Following a decision by the Liquor and Gambling Commissioner to restrict the type of live music played and the nights it can be performed, the Blackwood Community RSL is having to raise funds to sound proof its premises.

The Club has been a music venue for 25 years and is the only venue in the Hills to offer live music on a regular basis. It is also a substantial revenue stream for Blackwood RSL which it can not afford to lose.

The Club is renowned for its Blues scene and has had some high profile Blues performers including Australia's 'Godfather of Blues' Dutch Tilders, guitarist Chris Finnan and its 'Blues Jam' Tuesday night with the Bluescasters band was proving very popular.

"The building desperately needs to be upgraded to meet the sound proofing standards required at licensed venues today," said Frank Blamey, Community

RSL Manager. "We're in the process of getting quotes to do the work, but it will probably cost in the region of \$20,000 to bring the RSL into the 21st century.

"It's the base amps which are the problem," said Frank. "However, we still have live music every third Saturday and Sunday of the month - without the base amp though! Plus there are Rock 'n' Roll lessons on Tuesday nights."

The venue is also available for meetings and private functions.

"We've already had some donations come in and we'd be grateful for any support from local organisations and businesses and individuals," added Frank.

Other fundraising activities include applying for grants and there are plans to have a fundraising concert and a giant auction in near the future.

Suspect Stroke? Think F.A.S.T

This year Australians will suffer more than 60,000 new and recurrent strokes – that's one stroke every 10 minutes.

Prompt action can prevent further damage to the brain and help someone make a better recovery.

A stroke is the death of brain tissue resulting from lack of blood flow and insufficient oxygen to the brain. Another type of stroke (a cerebral haemorrhage) is caused by bleeding into brain tissue.

The signs of stroke could be any one or combination of the following: weakness or numbness, or paralysis – in the face, arm or leg; difficulty speaking or understanding; dizziness; sudden loss of vision; sudden and severe headache; difficulty swallowing. These signs may last only a few minutes or may last for several hours (called a transient ischaemic attack – TIA). They are often a warning of an impending stroke and must never be ignored.

Think '**FAST**' is the message which has come from the recent National Stroke Week. The '**FAST**' test is an easy way to recognise and remember the signs of a stroke and to be in a position to act quickly to get help.

Using the '**FAST**' test involves asking yourself three simple questions about the person you suspect might be in danger - and then acting quickly:

FACE – check their face, has the mouth drooped?

ARMS – can they lift both arms?

SPEECH – is their speech slurred? Do they understand you?

TIME – time is critical.

If you see any of the above signs, call 000 immediately.

Stroke is a medical emergency. If you experience the signs of stroke or see them in someone else, seek immediate medical attention.

The risk of stroke is influenced by a number of factors: age, gender, and family history and there's not much we can do about these issues. However, there are some simple lifestyle changes we can make which will reduce the risk of stroke and reduce the risk of heart disease, as well.

High blood pressure and high blood cholesterol levels are a major contributing factor to blood vessel disease which often leads to stroke. Both can sometimes be managed by changes to diet and exercise.

If you do need medicines to lower your blood pressure, the possibility is that they will need to be taken long term. At **JOHN SPICK PHARMACY** we can help you better understand your medicines and can provide printed information which our pharmacists are happy to go through with you.

There are other factors, too, which make stroke more likely – smoking, being overweight, having uncontrolled diabetes or having an irregular pulse (known as atrial fibrillation or AF).

Funding cuts threat to education

OVER 110 parents of students together with the staff from Belair Junior Primary and Belair Primary Schools conveyed universal opposition to the proposed amalgamation of their schools at public meetings held last month.

The meetings were convened as part of the consultative process being conducted by the Amalgamation Review Committee to determine whether to recommend amalgamation or not to the Minister for Education Jay Weatherill.

Affecting 500 school children, the move to amalgamate the Belair Schools is part of the State Government's plan to save \$8.2 million by lumping 42 co-located schools into 21 single schools.

On average, each school which amalgamates will lose around \$340,000 in ongoing funding and be forced to redesign its senior leadership structure. The budget cut will see the schools lose two principals, to be replaced by a single new one, as well as reductions in Student Support Officer (SSO) time.

Secretary of Belair Schools Governing Council, Stephen Madigan warned the simultaneous loss of both principals will have long term

impacts to the learning environment for the critical Reception to Year 2 levels, which sets the foundation of a child's learning and school experience. "The effect on the quality of education provided by Belair Schools clearly concerns parents," he added.

The State Government's defence of cut to education funding is that it will bring the funding model for the 21 co-located schools targeted for amalgamation in line with other schools in South Australia.

"Belair Schools is a shining example of how

co-located schools can work together. The current staffing structure is efficient and effective; the two Principals work in complete harmony together and create a highly professional education environment for the students benefit. I expect nothing less," added Stephen Madigan.

By popular demand, the closing date for submissions to the Amalgamation Review Committee was extended to the end of October.

This extra time will allow parents to become aware of and actively engage in this critical issue for Belair Schools and Stephen Madigan is urging all parents of students to become involved.

"If you care about your kid's early education then please oppose this amalgamation and find out how to make a submission to the Amalgamation Review Committee. Read the Belair Primary Schools newsletter and talk to other concerned parents," Madigan concludes. □





Summer brings trouble for our family pets



◆ With the warmer weather now upon us, snakes will start to come out of hibernation to soak up the sun. Pets can be very inquisitive so watch out for symptoms of a snake bite and seek immediate veterinary attention if your pet is bitten by a snake.

NOW the warmer weather is upon us isn't it fantastic to be out in the garden, or walking the dogs in our beautiful hills environment.

However spring and approaching summer also brings a range of problems and dangers for our dogs and cats: fleas, bees, snakes and grass seeds will be starting to cause health issues ranging from an itchy nuisance to a potentially life threatening illness.

This autumn we saw an unprecedented increase in the number of our patients with flea problems. Most likely this was due to our unusually mild, wet summer and it may follow that we continue to have significant increases in flea problems this year.

Grass seeds always cause problems, keeping vets busy removing them from ears, eyes, noses, abscesses and feet. Ensure your long haired dogs are clipped short before the grass dries off. Book now, the groomers will get very busy soon!

Also remember to check between your dogs toes regularly throughout the warmer months.

If your pet has a suddenly painful ear or eye they may have a seed hiding, which should be removed as soon as possible.

Bee stings will mostly cause mild local swelling and pain in dogs but sometimes severe reactions can occur. If a dog is suddenly weak, shivering, possibly vomiting, urgent veterinary attention should be sought. This could either be an acute allergic reaction to a bee sting, or the first symptoms of a snake bite.

Cats tend to avoid the bees but certainly not the snakes. Most of our snake bite patients are cats suffering from a brown snake bite.

Signs will range from mild weakness to paralysis and can take up to 24 hours to develop. Nearly all of these cats will recover with veterinary treatment including anti-venene, hospitalisation and supportive care.

If you see a snake in your garden please don't try to deal with it yourself. Keep safe and get a professional snake catcher to deal with the offender, there are a number of great local services available.

Snakes are on the move

MOST people associate the warmer days of spring with baby animals and flowers, but it's also the time of year when snakes emerge from their long winter sleep.

Department of Environment and Natural Resources Animal Welfare Manager Dr Deb Kelly said the first day of spring was a good reminder for people to clean up their properties in time for snake season.

"If you clear away rubbish, keep grass short and control rats and mice, that goes a long way towards discouraging snakes from moving in with you," Dr Kelly said.

The most common are the eastern brown, red-bellied black, copperhead, western brown and tiger snake. Brown snakes, in particular, like wood heaps, piles of rubbish, long grass and warm spots under corrugated iron roofs.

"If we leave snakes alone, they will usually leave us alone too," Dr Kelly said. "They are

mostly quite shy. Most people who are bitten are trying to kill or injure the snake at the time. It is vital to remember to never try to catch or kill a snake.

"If you do see a snake, leave it alone and watch where it goes. If it is not a threat, and for example, is outside and heading towards a paddock, do nothing.

"Pets can be very inquisitive and skittish when snakes are around, but hosing them with water is usually effective in getting them away. If you see a snake in the house, watch where it goes, get any children and pets out of the room and shut the door, then call a licensed snake catcher," explained Dr Kelly.

Back on the road again

THE familiar blue and white mobile vet van of 'Homecare Vet to Pet' has not been seen around Blackwood since June, with business owner Dr Rachel Westcott on sick leave. In early June, Rachel had open heart surgery to correct a congenital heart defect and wants to thank all her clients who sent 'get well' messages.

At this stage, the plan is to re-open the mobile veterinary service in late October. Clients can expect the same "at your doorstep" service from her walk-in, custom built vehicle.

A strong emphasis on preventative medicine will be the focus, with parasite prevention and 'spring' skin allergies common presentations. And correct nutrition and exercise after winter is just as significant for pets as for their humans! Insect vector control is also important, with mosquito-borne illnesses looking to become an increasing threat, due to the noticeable increase in tropical weather.

Rachel is also volunteer Coordinator of the South Australian Veterinary Emergency Management (SAVEM) Group, an organization which directs and manages the veterinary response to care for companion animals and wildlife, in an emergency incident, such as a bushfire.

Several training workshops for Veterinarians will have been completed by the end of the year, and community service groups are also welcome to learn more about this program.
