#### Hello!

This week we have a very special service. Our friends Kelsey and Marley will be welcomed to the family of God through Baptism.

There are some special symbols that are part of a Baptism.

There is a bowl on a stand.

It has water in it.

This is called a **font**.

Water is sprinkled onto the head of the person being baptised. This is a symbol that shows that in baptism we are made clean inside and outside.

Sometimes a **shell** is used to scoop up the water for sprinkling.

When Jesus was baptised a dove came down from sky.

The **dove** is a symbol of the Holy Spirit.

Sometimes you will see the symbol of a dove at a Baptism.

You will also see a cross to remind us that Jesus died a cross but that he rose again at Easter.

A candle is given to a baptised person to remind them that

Jesus is the light of the world.

You will find the story of Jesus's Baptism in the Bible. Matthew 3: 13 -17
